History

In 1968 he was overthrown by the architect Fernando Belaunde Terry in a coup led by his aide, General Juan Velasco Alvarado, who rule the country until 1975 causing a revolution in our economy and create this new issue.

1968 years of changes in Peru, with the new government came the new banknotes printed by Thomas de la Rue and protected by the Organic Law No. 13958 Central Reserve Bank of Peru, Law of past emissions. During this period characterized by the introduction of socializing and a host of new reforms in the country, and which includes first characters in the history of Peru in the face of all banknotes and back images of landmarks the country. It should be noted that during this government emphasized the nationalization of oil and fishing, as well as educational and agricultural reforms, creating a strong anti-imperialist position, with the introduction of characters and landmarks to circulating nationalism is trying to raise the people with the aid of notes, but not able to link people to their revolutionary action.

So the name displayed under the banknotes "According to Law No. 13958" printed on all Banknotes issued in 1968.



Banknotes issuance of 1.000 Soles was printed with a typographical error in the series where R1 77.234 banknotes were printed, printing the name of Don Francisco Bolognesi for Bologñesi (Using the letter Ñ instead of N). For subsequent broadcasts for similar banknotes in the series R2, R3 and R4, and issued from 1969 to 1975 corrected the error by making all banknotes issued in the R1 series of that year have a special feature.

500 Soles de Oro	TDLR	<p>Obverse: Next Left Representing Workers Working in the center the coat of the Nation by Der. Effigy of Don Nicolas de Pierola.</p> <p>Reverse: Image of the National Mint with 4 bullet with the number "500" on the 4 corners.</p>

Effigy of Don Francisco Bolognesi, this issue is a mistake printing the tickets with the name using the letter Ñ Bolognesi</p> <p>Reverse: Picture of Machu Picchu with 4 bullet with the number "1000" on the 4 corners..</p>

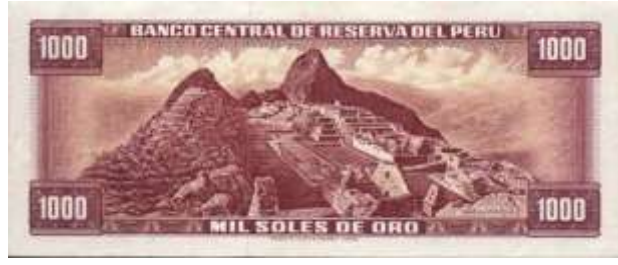
